

WARNING SIGNS

Discussing:

- · Death or a desire to die
- · Significant guilt or shame
- Identifying as a loser or burden on others

Feeling:

- Empty, hopeless, trapped, no reason to live
- Sadness, anxiousness, agitation, rage
- Unbearable emotional or physical pain

Behavioral Changes:

- Planning/researching death
- Withdrawing from friends/activities
- Giving away personal items
- Dangerous risk-taking such as driving fast
- Noticeable mood swings
- Significant appetite/sleep changes
- Increase in drug/alcohol use

If these warning signs apply to you or someone you know, get help as soon as possible, particularly if the behavior is new or has increased recently.
